2. Old Business

A. Masterman Mission and Vision Working Group

- Working group open to the community to discuss mission & vision
- At pre-SAC planning meeting, suggestion to hold off the group due to various changes currently in-flux at the school ie bell schedule, curriculum, etc.
- Suggestion to keep current mission & vision and revisit at another time.
 - Parent question Neha will raise to Principal: Will the current mission & vision be put back on website?
- When the discussion occurs, committee plans to use the middle schools accreditation model to revisit mission and vision.

- Parent suggestion to provide a liaison role to new members. Asher confirmed that current SAC members will support new SAC members through the transition.

3. New Business

A. School Security After Hours and at School Events

- There was no school security office for Saturday night performance of musical because the district could not staff the request from the school (approximately 800 people at the event).
- Request from admin for community to be present at SDP meetings regarding safety issues and to petition for additional security support for the school.
- District allocates number of School Safety Officers based on number of serious incidents at the school. Masterman is allocated only 1 School Safety Officer due to low incidence rate at the school.
 - Concern raised that one officer is insufficient for a school of 1200 students.
 - SSO is not armed; provided extensive training from SDP; many have law enforcement background but not required. Read more here.
 - enforcement background but not required. <u>Read more</u>
- Request for Safety committee to examine this issue.

 - Add 1 or 2 SBTL
 - Add Climate Manager

E. 8 Period vs. 7 Period Topic

- Questions & concerns from SAC meeting:
 - Building committee negotiate with administration by May 25th about schedule challenges
 - GAMP & Carver have 8 period days
 - Before COVID, there were very vibrant options for students during the options period. Examples of past courses-Architecture, Shakespeare, Philosophy, Middle Eastern Politics and more. Sometimes taught by teachers and sometimes by community members and parents. There was a staff member dedicated to

organizing this time. There doesn't seem to be a push from administration to reinstitute these opportunities. Why isn't this being explored?

- Community would like to see teacher feedback on schedule change.
- Many Masterman students are above grade level in ELA & Math. The instructional times required by the district were not enforced in Masterman in the past. If the students are excelling, why the need to change?
- Has the administration considered the negative impact of the proposed changes to foreign language pathway for Masterman HS students when they apply to selective colleges? If MS students receive one year of French, and then HS students are only required to take two years of Spanish (with an option to take AP Spanish w/o a Spanish 3 level offered) they will be at a disadvantage when applying to selective colleges, including Ivy League schools, which encourage applicants to take 3 or more. Examples: Harvard encourages 4 years, Stanford prefers 3 or more, colleges seek students with mastery in one language rather than a cursory knowledge of numerous languages as would be the case of the Masterman proposed pathway of 1 year of French and 2 years of Spanish.
- Input: Can there be another meeting for budget/schedule at a later time? Is the schedule decision finalized or will input be used to make a decision? What say does the building committee and PFT have on the budget and schedule changes? How will parent input and questions be solicited? Will there be Google Form? Will there be follow-up to questions and concerns? Do teachers agree with these changes? How was feedback from teachers collected, and when will it be shared with the community?
- Understanding: Why is the change necessary? How will the change resolve the issues? What is the requirement and why now? Is the concern about instructional minutes a current mandate from SDP? What will take place in extended advisory? Is there a benefit to this change for the middle school, or is the MS just accommodating a decision made for the high school? How does schedule change impact budget? If yes, we want to see the impact and see the different budgets.
- Enrichment classes: How are enrichment classes & teachers effected by schedule change? Will there be a reduction of instructional time students receive in enrichment classes including art, music, digital literacy, library and Physical education? Will each grade in middle school have at least 1 period a week of art, music, digital literacy, library, gym, health? Will every grade in middle school have art and music and gym?
- Highschool 8th period: How will students receive the current programming they have during 8th period ie tutoring, lessons, participate in external programming? Students in sports will miss instructional time in new schedule. Why not explore providing options for high school during 8th period? Can the school hire someone or provide a staff member time to organize as was done in the past?

 - Many students were leaving the school early
 - Administration worried about accountability/monitoring of these students
 - High school students are now in auditorium or cafeteria with teacher monitoring
 - Change will provide extended advisory to accommodate some of the things currently occurring during 8th period (ie tutoring)
