5. The addition of this language in the community handbook:

A new concern about False allegations and lack of documentation for explicit consequences for lodging false allegations was raised.

This was the new language that was shared with us:

 Any student identified as part of an active investigation regarding a school infraction or a violation of the School District of Philadelphia's established Code of Conduct may be prohibited from participating in any scheduled extra-curricular activities until investigation procedures have been completed, which will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

Masterman Community Handbook (current language introduced at the start of 23-24)

page 17 under Athletics, Music & Arts, & Extracurricular Activities. • Students, teams or clubs who are part of an active investigation may be prohibited from participating in scheduled activities until investigation procedures are completed. This was raised by a parent in the Dec SAC meeting. This new language in the student/community handbook removes a student's right to due process. Last year, the baseball team forfeited their season because of an allegation that when investigated cleared them.

Also, according to the student handbook page 1/2 : "Disclaimer: This document is subject to change. Updates to the Student Handbook will be provided to the students and <u>changes will be</u> <u>made to the online version</u> of the document and will be included in any subsequent printing or publishing of the document."

New concern raised that the school would be taking really seriously and this was discussed with Mr. Gordon. This falls under the purview of the office of the assistant superintendent, office of student life and the office of student rights.
