<u>School Advisory Councils (SACs)</u> are formal structures created by the School District of Philadelphia to provide an avenue for partnership and collaboration. A School Advisory Council (SAC) is a peer-elected, collaborative team that works to improve student achievement, effective teaching in the classroom, and parent and community engagement in the educational process.

Masterman's SAC is composed of the school principal, eight elected family members, five teachers, and two students - one HS and one MS representative. We also include HS Student Government Association (SGA) student leaders as part of the SAC. Masterman SAC is governed by <u>JRM SAC By-Laws</u>. SAC's get their mandate from the School District of Philadelphia's Board of Education Resolution - <u>SDP BoE 920 Policy</u>.

2. Facilities Update:

Check if anyone from the facilities office is attending the SAC meeting and offer them a forum for updates.

Thank you to the District Facilities department for their continued engagement in our community and their partnership.

- Latest asbestos update: AHERA inspections and documentation: https://drive.google.com/drive/folders/1dN0Mder-CJJfgV2FHEPWHpkd3F3NyJwB
- Repairing peeling paint on rooftop paint has been scraped.
- Pooling water on the roof. The roof was replaced in 2023 as part of a capital project. Per the principal, plumbers came to the roof and addressed the water pooling issue.
- Bathroom/sanitation issues Impact of over-enrollment, need for more custodial staff: Waiting to hear
 back from deputy superintendent's office. Per the principal, he met with the district and they offered
 overtime as a short term solution. The administration will continue to push for additional staff. The school
 will also prioritize areas of importance, like bathrooms during the day (e.g. stocking the bathrooms).
- Regular facilities update: Mr. Woods is taking inventory of air purifier needs.
 - A parent noted a logistics issue of student access to lockers as their student does not have time to go to their lockers in between periods.Per AP Harrison, lockers are assigned based on advisories.
 - Another parent asked if there are enough lockers for all students due to the school's
 overenrollment. AP Harrison noted that students are sharing lockers. Ms. Geiger noted that MS
 students share lockers, while HS students receive their own lockers this year. Another parent
 noted that there is a scheduling concern as students do not have time to go to their locker during
 the day.

5. Principal's Update:

- National Merit Semi Finalists for 2026.
- Open Houses, Shadow days, Club fairs
 - o Open house: Per the principal, over 1200 students attended the various school open houses.
- FACE person available for portal help?
- One Masterman
- School Wide_PSSA and Keystone Metrics : <u>LINK</u>

Meetings to be scheduled with Principal Laurie:

- 1. Plan is shared Meeting TBD
- 2. Title 1 Fall meeting: Ms. Harrison will schedule this week
- The principal provided clarification on:
 - SEPTA and tardiness: if a student has issues concerning SEPTA, the student can come to the office to resolve tardiness.
 - Chromebook charging: there was a communication that students may not charge their chromebook at school. The principal clarified that the school will look into charging chromebooks during school time.
 - HS picnics. After discussing with SGA, the school will rescind the loss of Spirit Days for impacted students.
 - Homework policy. There were parent concerns raised about homework due dates and times. The principal noted that they will work with the instructional cabinet and teachers to find a resolution.
- Recognized student achievement re: HS Merit Scholars.
- Sixty seven 8th grade students signed up for HS shadow days.
- Noted the success of the HS club fair. The school will look into different spaces rather than the cafeteria.
- New FACE representative. The principal noted parent Portal access issues, and the school will
 work with the new FACE person to address this issue (potentially 1:1 meetings).
- ONE Masterman (aka Middle States): the principal noted the success as feedback was largely positive and impactful. AP Harrison noted that the purpose is to bridge the MS with HS students. Historically, this was known as the "Middle States". It will be once a month on Tuesday morning during extended advisory. Overwhelmingly positive feedback on One Masterman.
- Kudos to Ms. Neu for spearheading the One Masterman initiative.
- PSSA and Keystones are the external measure on how the school is performing and Principal Laurie shared the preliminary topline results for 2024-25 for Masterman.
 - PSSA ELA results skewing YOY on a reduction of advanced, about the same for Proficient and increasing into Basic. It shifts from 65% to 55% in Advanced which is concerning.
 - PSSA Math results YOY 23/24 to 24/25 shows a dip in Advanced.

- Keystones Algebra 1 Significant decrease in Advanced YOY and significant increase in Basic and Below Basic.
- Retesting Keystones data has remained consistent.
- Keystone Biology- with the new Bio curriculum data no Below Basic. And all retesters passed.
- Keystone Literature 23/24 even split between advanced and proficient and 24/25 dip in advanced and also have below basic.
- A parent asked if the school may provide YoY scores with the same cohort. The principal agreed that such data can be provided.
- Question whether Masterman students taking the test online had any impact on the scores, given that not all schools took the tests online as it was not required to be online
 - Principal Laurie will look at the data and more will be investigated during the PESO meeting.
- Question- how will the rescinding the Spirit day punishment be communicated to the students. All students will be informed by Principal Laurie.
- A SAC input regarding Online PSSA was submitted and the Facilitator indicated that this needs to be addressed by the district and Masterman SAC is not the forum for this.
- Facilitator and Principal Laurie stressed that while anonymous comments/inputs are always welcome, leaving your name provides an opportunity for SAC to get back to you appropriate answers and for the school administration to figure out the grade that will be the issue.
- Title One Meeting will be coordinated by Ms. Harrison. It will most likely be the week of October 27th. A portal training will also be planned in conjunction with the Title 1 Meeting.
- There is a trip being planned to Barcelona and Madrid for high school students. The trip to Spain is open to any high school student who is taking Spanish at Masterman.

9. Old and New Business:

I. Teachers and Staffing Update

- Teachers/Academic Staff
 - Update on hire for open Math position for 7th grade, BC Calc and Geometry. When is the teacher expected to start? What is the plan to catch students up? Mr. Ladj is 45% onboarded. I spoke with him today and we plan to meet the November 3rd expected start date. He will be in to observe and begin the transition next week.
 - Two full time Math positions have been posted
 - What is the status of the current hire (1 year or long term)
 - Resumes for these positions and interview status?
 - Status On Boarding of new teachers and what supports and training are they being provided to be successful
 - Current situation
 - 7th Grade Math Ms. Geiger
 - BC Calc lecture class with Mr. Ostrikov
 - 10th Grade Geometry will be taught by Mr. Lam and Ms. Burge,
 - How will the assessments given so far be reviewed and graded in group lessons? Which teacher will be responsible to monitor student learning/grading? The math department is meeting in PLC to distribute grading tasks. Grades have been entered.
 - Ms. Graham is the teacher of record, and will put in student grades and assessments in Infinite Campus.
 - The tests are being graded by the teachers in an assembly line fashion to ensure consistency.
 - Thank you to the Math department for stepping up and doing additional work to support the students and vacancy.
- Climate Staff: One position open (we have a reliable sub)
 - The principal noted there will be a daily sub. This sub worked with the school last year.
- Custodial Staff- Filled but need more due to overcapacity in the building
 - There is a vacancy in custodial staff and having one person taking a day off puts tremendous pressure on the rest of the team.

- Crossing Guard Mr. Terrence Henry
 - Corner of Spring Garden and 17th street and he is there everyday in the morning and afternoon.
 - He is there from 7-9am and evening??
 - He was not there during early dismissal and needed to communicate with him with change of school schedules.

II. Academics

- Syllabus, grading policy and weightage, expectations of when work will be posted and when it needs to be turned in, absence policy regarding extra time, communication expectations for families to contact the teacher, testing days/dates.
- Homework Deadlines- Is there a school wide policy on when Homework can be posted and when it should be due? Currently there is a wide discrepancy as to when homework is due (Midnight or Sunday at 3.00pm etc) Also some homework is assigned over days off for holiday observance.
 - 1) homework due when class isn't in session? homework due on Fridays at midnight, or Sundays at 3pm (both HS and MS). Can homework be due at class time or at least 8am on a school day?
 - 2) Homework assigned over days off that are for holiday observance (for example, HW assigned Monday and due Wednesday for a Tuesday holiday). For students observing the holiday there is not time to complete it on time. Homework scheduled to be due at midnight -- students should be given until the next class period to complete their HW. And assignment due at midnight does not offer students the flexibility to complete it on their own schedule and causes unnecessary stress.)
- Parity of lessons/learning, opportunities, and grading across a grade band.
 Input: My daughter has a teacher who has been giving some of his sections more time to finish a test than others -- a section that has a double period got more time than her section which was only a single period that day. She reports that kids in her class did terribly on the test and not everyone had time to finish. She is not comfortable bringing this situation to the teacher -- is there another option? The teacher told them their grades, called people out, but has not input any grades so far this year.)
- Grade Book Updates: Friday is the deadline for interim reports. In the future what can parents expect and how should they communicate with the school when grades aren't updated. (Sometimes grades are updated in Google Classroom and not infinite Campus which does not help knowing what the students grade actually is) ☐ Infinite Campus_Google Passback Stepper.pdf
 Inputs: Several inputs regarding the lack of grades for geometry only 3 hw assignments have been graded and updated on IC
- Algebra 2 Concerns from families that students do not seem to be adequately prepared with foundational Algebra 1 skills.
 - Input: Although it is early in the school year, I am writing to express concern that my 9th grade child (been at Masterman since 5th does not seem to be adequately prepared for Algebra II this school year, it appears that the foundation from Algebra I during the prior school year may not have been as strong as needed to support success in the current course. Algebra I + II readiness were topics of discussion at SAC last school year. I would appreciate it if the administration could share how the school is monitoring student performance in Algebra II, particularly with respect to identifying and supporting students who may not have mastered key Algebra I concepts.
- Instrumental Music Credits HS -Update on honors vs no credit update? When will a decision be made?

- Students can decide if they want to take this for credit or not but the school cannot update the honors credit without district approval.
- Communication to families on how to access PSSA and Keystone scores? Families not in the know might not realize they are available on the Portal to access.
 - Principal Laurie will send an email informing families on how to access the PSSA and Keystone scores.

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- Clarification on No Chromebook charging for MS in school policy.
 Input: Clarity on policy and the need for it? How is it enforced and what potential learning disruptions it could cause? Has it been viewed with an equity lens?
- Update on National Junior Honor's Society
 Input: Last year, a group of 7th grade students were selected to be a part of National Junior Honor
 Society. Has there been any information disseminated regarding an award ceremony and responsibilities for this year?

Principal Laurie will send an update and there was an update from Ms Amit that the meeting has been scheduled for October 23rd

 Principal Laurie communicated his desire and working towards consistency across various classes and bringing forward parity across classes and experiences are similar. Support teacher autonomy but provide predictability for students.

III. Testing PSSA/PSAT/SAT and AP Self-Study

- PSSA Prep What is the strategy for prep and what resources will be used? Will all teachers follow the same prep strategy?
 - The school has a number of District provided resources. Teachers are expected to be consistent on the prep across the grades.
- AP Self-Study assembly: When will it be scheduled, and which grades will participate? Will eligibility and
 information be shared with parents as parental support is critical for student success? Students
 interested in AP Self-Study should visit with their counselor.
 - AP self-study is generally only offered for courses that are not offered in Masterman and Mr. Gilken will provide information to students.
- In 2019 the District paid for each student to take the SAT twice. Is the District only paying for 1 SAT test now in the Spring of Junior year?
 - The principal will meet with the school counselors. Parents stated that there is a fee waiver code that they may use to take the SAT for free.

IV. Over-enrollment Student Life:

One Masterman:

Input: Positive feedback from their student on this new initiative. Thank you for implementing.

Lockers:

Are there sufficient lockers for all students?

Which grades are sharing lockers and are they close or accessible to their main classes?

Fifth graders are neither allowed to go to their lockers nor allowed the use of their backpack to carry their things around the school for different classes?

Classroom sizes/Desks:

Are appropriate sized classrooms being used for classes and do all rooms have enough chairs and desks for all students? Has this been inventoried or is it the teacher's responsibility to inform administration? Do teachers know the process?

The district provided desks sized for HS students. The school received a quote (\$10K) to purchase additional slim profile desks so the smaller classrooms can be used appropriately and the large profile desks from these rooms will be moved to replace damaged desks in other classrooms.

Attendance:

Absent exempt for sanctioned school activities process.

Also <u>the school handbook</u> directs families to Ms. Lambert to report absences and Ms. McIntyre to rectify attendance issues. Is this the current policy?

Input:

Can there be a system to excuse students who are missing class periods to attend music lessons. My child gets always marked unexcused absent and I need to follow up with Ms. McIntyre to get it excused. This happens even though my child informs the teacher of the missed period ahead of time that he will be at a lesson (8th grade).

- •All paper absence notes should be handed to the Student's advisor or the main office in a timely fashion (see the District's guidelines below). Please make all notes legible. We request that Parents use the portal to check their child's attendance regularly and contact Ms. McIntyre with any questions regarding unexcused absences
- •If you are sending an email for High School or Middle School students emails should be sent to Ms. Lambert in the main office (mlambert@philasd.org) and the student's Advisory (homeroom) teacher.

 Principal Laurie will clarify the attendance issue and update the handbook if needed.

Cellphones:

Input: Many schools have moved to a no phone policy and I've only heard positive reviews (educators, parents and kids too). What are Masterman's plans?

The principal noted that there has been no phone referrals due to a student being on the phone during his time at the school. Noted that phone use at the school has not seen the same impact compared to other schools - attributed this to the school's academic rigor.

Supplies Input from Last SAC? SAC Recommendation:

When would be a good time for grade level teachers to have the task of (when they meet for common planning) of collaboratively coming up with an integrated supply list for each grade for next year based on supplies the students are actually using this year. Could we ask them to take a look through the lens of students - commute, weight of backpack and ease of access/ use of supplies in the classroom for effective teaching, learning and commuting.

High School Picnic:

Littering and loss of a day of Spirit week as consequence. Inputs: many

General theme of collective punishment being unfair, confusion regarding how discipline process works at the whole school level, suggestions on what adults - teachers and chaperones can do to make sure public places are left clean and tidy after a trip, spirit week is one of the most cherished experiences as a Masterman high schooler, SGA works really hard to organize these events for students.

The input process with the SAC form worked in this case and Principal Laurie thanked everyone who contacted and wrote thoughtful responses which did inform the change in the decision by the school. Principal Laurie highlighted the need for considerate communication from the school to families.

Lateness due to SEPTA delays:

Clarity New School Wide policy that was only communicated to students that delays due to SEPTA will not be excused? (Previous School policy and current District policy: If a student is late due to Septa service issues and delays- parents need to send a note to school for an excused tardy.) Input:

- Is there a reason why this new policy was put in place when lateness due to SEPTA was always excused in the past?
- o If this is the policy, can this be communicated to the families widely
- How is this being enforced?
- Number of lateness due to SEPTA since the policy has been put in place that have not been excused?

V. SEPTA Cuts/ Unreliability:

Septa has not restored all bus routes and the regional rail commuters are under particular strain with cancellations and delays following the emergency orders for maintenance after several fires.

- Number of lateness and absences due to SEPTA since school has started in the school? Can SAC have the numbers submitted to the District before the court verdict?
- Is District still requiring submission of numbers?
- SAC survey is being worked on it will be important to get clarification on school policy and numbers before sending out the survey.

Reiterated the negative imp n RR students as well. Issues to be raised to the district as the budget concern will be ongoing due to the state using emergency funding.
