 - Principal Laurie introduced the new FAM, Mr. Anthony Greene.
 - Principal Laurie noted there is a bidding process for new custodial hiring. There is currently a temporary custodial assistance at the school, but the position is currently open. There is a new Building Engineer (Mr. Tom McKnight) beginning Dec. 12th. Mr. Woods' last day is Dec 16th.
 - Principal Laurie provided a safety update around crowd control and violence near the school, in particular near the SEPTA stop at Broad and Spring Garden and protests happening nearby. The school has begun discussions with the district and whether Masterman qualifies for a safety corridor.
 - After-school club end times: a parent asked if MS club end times may be posted. The principal will survey the teacher club sponsors for times.
 - The principal noted the NJHS induction ceremony and how well the event went. Gave a shout out to Ms. Hemminger who is the teacher sponsor.
 - SGA Friendsgiving Potluck - noted how well planned and fun the event was.
 - Musical: the Wiz (Feb 26-28): the principal highlighted the upcoming Musical and asked students to audition for the show.
 - MS/HS Winter concerts: Dec 11th for MS; Dec 18th for HS. The principal noted there will be a new way to pay for concert tickets rather than CASH only. Recognized Ms. Cruz for the new payment methods.
 - The administration met with the cabinet to discuss the homework policy. The purpose of homework is to reinforce learning from the classroom; and to develop study habits and time management skills. A teacher noted that study hall in middle school and high school are beneficial for students to complete their homework and other assignments. The administration will continue to discuss with the cabinet on developing the school's homework policy (including consistency on how/when homework is posted; the amount of homework assigned across classes, due dates/times, chunking of assignments, late work policies, etc.).
 - Currently, the standard Google deadline is midnight, the same day, for homework assignments.
 - Family life and celebrations should trump homework and school holiday calendar should be adhered to.
 - Midterms. In discussion is the scheduling/timing of midterms, this includes student dismissal times. The principal raised consistencies on the format of a given midterm exam to ensure equity across classes.
 - Double blind grading mechanism for exams to ensure unbiased outcomes.
 - The first Midterm is on Jan 9th, so students should know what will be on the midterm before the winter break so there is time for students to study and prepare.
 - Students with accommodations are accounted for and make ups are planned for sick children and families will know the schedule of the midterms beforehand.
 - The tentative Midterm schedule is as follows:
 - January 9 - English and World Language/Electives
 - January 12 - Math and Social Studies/Electives
 - January 13 - Science/Electives
 - January 15 - Make-up day
 - Principal Laurie introduced Ms. Shapiro (SBTL). Ms. Shapiro introduced herself. This is her 3rd year as a SBTL and has been supporting teachers on best practices for the all new curriculum that is being implemented by the district. "Imagine" was procured for all of middle school - helps with small group and

differentiated education. In PLC (?? full form) - they go through the curriculum (for both core and electives) and plan. STAR Assessment period is going on right now and teachers are working together to make sure all students are being assessed.

- January 6th is Winter Keystones and there is an eligibility list of students who will take them then. Remediation support is being provided to the students so they are prepared for it.
- Masterman has been selected for NAEP testing this year for 8th grade for English and Math. 50 Students are randomly chosen and they take the test on February 19th 2026.
- SAT's for 11th grade in Spring and PSSA's and Keystone in the spring. Teachers are receiving their PSSA prep material for English and Math soon. There is an online platform called Firefly for students to practice tests for PSSA.(5-8th) with just multiple choice questions which they will get access soon as well.

II. Academics

- Homework Deadlines- school wide policy communication - update
 - Refer to Principal's update for details.
- Parity of lessons/learning, opportunities, and grading across a grade band. - update

- Efforts are to be made to ensure timely updates.
- Communication to families on how to access PSSA and Keystone score - Stepper to be sent out.
Principal will send out the Stepper soon.

III. Testing PSSA/PSAT/SAT and AP Self-Study

- AP Self-Study: Timeline: suggested improvements. Early signups/approvals to ensure students have enough time to prepare so drop off rate is not high, and students can find sites to take the exam, instead of being shut out.
 - Students are able to do AP Self-Study, which a number of students currently participate in. The school plans to host a number of AP Self-Study exams.
 - About 50% of students who elect to self-study an exam historically have dropped out. So this year, students were asked to commit to taking it or the cost of the exam will be passed on the student.
 - While access for students is always nice, students should seek advice from the counselors on whether it is prudent or necessary for that student to take the self study.
 - Masterman does not have the space to accommodate all students so they are exploring external locations to support all students and access to the exams that they want.
 - This timeline will be brought forward next year based on the learnings and parents are more involved in the process.
 - Parent concern: that the entire process is not very transparent and the school should communicate better regarding the process.
- SAT fees 2 extra opportunities possible through SAttDP - If this program is funded already can our students have access to it?

IV. Student Life:

Community Building:

Halloween door decoration didn't happen - Winter door decoration was suggested by the principal, in preSAC as an alternative to ensure MS students have the opportunity.

Attendance:

1. Absent exempt for sanctioned school activities process to notify and correct errors.
2. Process clarification: Is advisor/attendance secretary or someone else responsible for making updates and how should parents request corrections.
 - The school handbook will be corrected to reflect that Ms. Lambert is the contact person for absences.
 - Always reach out to Ms. Lambert for any attendance issues for now.

Lateness due to SEPTA delays:

Communication on process to correct attendance due to Septa Lateness

SEPTA Cuts/ Unreliability still affects student's ability to sometimes get to school and return home at a reasonable hour. Septa has not restored all bus routes and the regional rail commuters are under particular strain with uncertainties.

- Request to Principal Laurie to communicate to families on the process to communicate lateness in the morning due to SEPTA issues.

VII. NEW Business from SAC input forms:

- I. School Leadership: I want to recognize the hard work and meaningful impact of Principal Laurie's leadership at Masterman. His steady presence, positivity, and clear commitment to students have made a remarkable difference in a very short time. Students feel supported, seen, and encouraged to strive for their best. Staff have shared how his collaborative approach and calm, thoughtful communication have helped rebuild trust and strengthen our shared purpose.
Principal Laurie's leadership extends beyond the building. Families and community members feel welcomed and informed, and his willingness to listen and engage has brought a renewed sense of unity. Masterman is a better, stronger school because of his efforts.
Thank you for considering this acknowledgement of the positive effect he continues to have on our entire community.
- II. AP French: Question about where the administration is with planning AP for the current 9th and 10th grade classes?g for advanced learning in world languages. Will there be the option of Fren There was a "town hall" last year and there was no clear direction because, among other reasons, there was not a second French language instructor in place. Now that this role has been filled, can the administration provide an update? I had a student take advanced Spanish at CCP because another district school did not have advanced language options, and it was not an acceptable substitution. Thank you
 - There will be French 3 and 4 for current 9th graders and possible AP French with a combined French 3 /4 class with the option to take AP French in Senior.
 - CCP does not offer French 3 or 4 options.
 - Can this be holistically looked at to include Spanish and other course offerings as well.
- III. GIEP Assemments: Delayed GIEP assessment/development due to understaffing/over enrollment. More info about what gifted support will be provided would be helpful. Clarification of process regarding how activities/field trips and end of year trips are organized for each grade and how that information is shared with parents.
 - The school psychologist, who is at the school 2 days a week, will test students for a Gifted designation.
 - We have 150 students who are either eligible or are being assessed.
 - We have two Gifted teachers who are partially released.

- Things are delayed but resource constraints are the reason and there is a larger conversation happening by the leadership to figure out how the GIEP program should look like in Masterman.
- Very small number of students are getting accelerated in Math but every other subject is only enrichment through independent projects.
- Exploring options of the AP Seminar/Research for students to do college level research work for high school students.
- Currently most of the GIEP students are in Middle school and conversations are happening with the district on whether it is feasible to partially release another teacher to support more students at the expense of all other students.

IV. Sickness Policy: What is the policy and process for a child who is sick at school to go to the nurse? There seems to be issues with sick kids being able to see the nurse when needed.

- The current policy is that students who need to see the nurse need to tell their teacher and they are permitted to go to the nurse's office.
- Principal Laurie will explore and answer the questions based on the inputs he has received.

- V. Advisory: Thoughtful input around advisory/study hall: I think that the school community generally agrees that this is valuable, however, my thought is that the time could be more intentional, especially if we treat it as a shared responsibility between teachers and students. A meaningful start to the day, consistent across all Sections. A well-designed advisory (framework) can help students feel connected, organized, and aware of what's happening in their school community.
- VI. Grade field trips and end of year activities: Clarification of process regarding how activities/field trips and end of year trips are organized for each grade and how that information is shared with parents.
- Multiple models for Class sponsors are being looked at. Principal Laurie is continuing to discuss with the team to figure out best practices and bringing back legacy experiences for students. Students are asked for their input on field trips and year end trips.
